ALEXANDRA NECHITA

From a very young age, Alexandra Nechita has been hailed as a true artistic force. Born in Romania, Alexandra immigrated to the United States before she turned two. She began drawing as a toddler, and at the age of eight held her first solo exhibition in Los Angeles. Her talent was instantly recognized and art critics and the media alike began telling the world about this rare child prodigy, a “Petit Picasso,” a master of line, color and a visual language of her own.

Over the course of the last three decades, her work has evolved to encompass her growth and transitions. From childhood to adolescence and motherhood, her work has remained deeply rooted in the vibrancy of life. Capturing the essence of human connection and transformation. Each piece is a reflection of her inner world, a mosaic of thoughts and feelings translated into a visual form.

Alexandra’s work has been displayed internationally, including exhibitions in Romania, Switzerland, Netherlands, Italy, France, England, US, Singapore, Japan, Australia and New Zealand. Her art sits in the permanent collections of museums throughout the world, including the Vatican Collection in Rome, The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland and The National Museum Of Singapore, to name a few. Alexandra’s work is also in many private collections of A-List celebrities, Corporate and Government collections.

In her continued mission to bring communities together through art, she has found a variety of ways to play an active role in bridging the gap between traditional gallery exhibitions and engagement via public installations.

Alexandra graduated from the University of California at Los Angeles in 2008 with a degree in Fine Arts and currently resides in Los Angeles with her husband, daughter, son, and their three dogs.

RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Alexandra's "Love Anatomy" a monumental bronze, was installed in partnership with The City Of Beverly Hills on the Burton Way sculpture median, being the first females artist represented across from City Hall.

Commissioned by The Hollywood Partnership with The City of Hollywood, Alexandra completed a larger than life mural on the iconic intersection of Hollywood and Highland, bringing together local school kids and volunteers to help throughout the multi day process.

Alexandra has been on television screens world wide as a judge on Amazon Prime's Play-Doh Squished, a family show where adults and kids compete in the ultimate Play-Doh challenge. Furthermore, she completed her first Artist In Residence program at the iconic Beverly Hills Hotel last Fall.
